Background and objectives of the seed funding call (1/2)civis

What does CIVIS do to enhance research collaborations?

Job opportunities, training offers, career development resources as well as the development of a community of practice and partnership possibilities are some of the advantages of evolving as a researcher in the CIVIS Alliance.

A few examples of CIVIS added-value:

- Enhancing mobility (especially for early-careers researchers, i.e., MSCA, post-docs and Ph.D. candidates)
- Facilitating the sharing of research infrastructures (memorandum of understanding, online platform, etc.)
- Fostering collaboration with non-academic partners (e.g., staff weeks and training, collaborative projects, etc.)
- Supporting networking (e.g., research groups platform, seed-funding calls, support to European collaborative projects application, etc.)

Background and objectives of the seed funding call (2/2) ivis through this call contributes to developing research collaborations?

A first edition of the seed-funding call was set up in 2024, in order to strengthen and highlight our collaborations in the fields of R&I.

→ The Alliance provided seed funding to 25 projects that aimed at facilitating African-European research collaboration and is thrilled to renew and broaden this experience this year.

Call objectives:

- Stimulating **bottom-up**, **research-oriented initiatives** across CIVIS universities in Hub thematic areas;
- Contributing to sustainable academic networks through support for grant proposal development;
- Creating opportunities for all academics, including early-career researchers;
- Enhancing participatory research, interdisciplinarity and challenge-based research;
- Encouraging collaboration between CIVIS members in Europe and Associated Members in Africa.

The dynamic EU-African research (funding) landscape: an opportunity for & through CIVIS



Funding opportunities

Horizon Europe , the European Union's framework programme for research and innovation, is open to the world, which means that participants from almost any country can participate in most calls. The EU can fund the participation in Horizon Europe collaborative research actions of entities established in EU Member States, in countries Associated to Horizon Europe, and in low- and middle-income countries. Most African partner countries are included in this latter category.

Africa Initiative II (the Horizon Europe Work Programme 2023-2024 includes around 30 topics to boost EU-African cooperation in research and innovation. It reflects the EU-AU joint priorities on research and innovation and enables the implementation of the short-term and medium-term actions of the AU-EU Innovation Agenda. Open calls.

Mediterranean Initiative (): The Horizon Europe work programme 2023-2024 includes 37 topics that are flagged as particularly relevant for cooperation with the Mediterranean region. The calls can be found Open calls.

Seed funding for African-European research collaborations

<u>Objective</u>: to initiate new collaborative research projects within CIVIS and/or at preparing applications to larger research grants (e.g. European calls), in any of the 5 CIVIS thematic hubs:









Hub 3 - Health

Two Categories of Supported Activities



such as but not limited to:

- Doctoral schools or other training measures for PhD students
- Workshops or topical schools on a research question
- Network meetings for establishing a research group within CIVIS and/or reaching out to non-academic stakeholders
- Workshops for preparing a larger publication on research outcomes (pay attention to the fact that the project cannot cover publication cost).
- Citizen science projects

New collaborative research activities

Application design measures

Meetings of potential or designated applicants/consortium members (or writing team)

Visits of the PI and/or other key

Visits of the PI and/or other key participants to (potential) consortium members

Applicant will clearly state how the envisioned activities will lead to a fully-fledged research grant and which funding program and/or call they target.





Who can apply?

- Permanent faculty members, employees with a long-term contract (beyond the end of the funding period)
- Postdoctoral researchers are encouraged to participate in applications
- Main contact person/applicant must be for organisational reason from one European CIVIS University

Which costs are eligible?

- Only staff mobility costs (travel, accommodation, subsistence) within Europe and from Europe to Africa, up to 10,000 EUR
- Staff mobility costs from Africa to Europe can be funded by some but not all CIVIS European universities through co-funding measures
- Participants' costs for the University of Glasgow and Lausanne cannot be covered by Erasmus+ budget but own institutional funds can be used
- Some universities may have additional funds available for organisational costs
- Co-funding from other sources is encouraged.
- <u>Double-funding from the same third-party funding</u> institution or programme may however <u>be restricted</u>

In any case, you are invited to contact your local CIVIS local Office and avoid doubt!



Eligibility criteria

- Involve at least three CIVIS Universities, among which at least two European universities
- Relate to one of the CIVIS Hub themes (see above)
- Align with one of the activity types described above (collaborative activity or application design measures)
- Be implemented by June 30th, 2026

These eligibility criteria should imperatively be met to proceed with further evaluation.

Evaluation criteria



- Academic criteria (max 10 points, equal sub-items, and minimal threshold 5 points)
- Sustainability beyond this seed funding call (max 6 points, and minimal threshold 3 points)

Other preference criteria (max 4 points, no minimal threshold)

- CIVIS consortium: at least one of the six African partners
- Demonstrating interdisciplinarity
- Addressing societal challenges
- Contribution to citizen/participatory science (collaborative research activities)



Timeline



How to apply?



- Application for this seed-funding <u>must be done online only</u> through the <u>CIVIS</u>
 <u>Application Portal</u>
- Application deadline: May 31st, 2025 (24:00 CEST/UTC+2)
- Applicants who plan to organise an event at a CIVIS university should consult the local CIVIS Office/contact person at the potential host university before submitting the application.



How to fill in the budget table?

- Applicants can download the budget template <u>here</u>
- The budget <u>must be uploaded in the online application form</u>
- Costs <u>must respect Erasmus+ rules</u> for participants from European CIVIS member universities
- <u>Double funding</u> from the same third-party funding institution or programme is restricted (co-funding is possible & welcome!)
- This Call does not cover Ph.D. or Postdoc scholarships

- Several CIVIS universities interested by the topic: UofG, UAM, UB, NKUA & UNIL
- Mixed group consisting of academics and integration programmes
- Meeting in November 2024
 - Best practices exchange (how to set up programmes, useful methodologies to work with marginalized migrants, etc.)
 - Discussion with (local) stakeholders
 - Interest in the diversity of contexts and how we can learn from each other
 - Definition of the group's priorities (research, capacity-building, etc.)
- Development of an Open Lab project in 2025 aiming at investigating new institutional capacities/instruments/resources for developing or improving new lifelong learning access for migrants (meetings in Lausanne in April 2025 & in Glasgow in May 2025)
 - Mapping of needs
 - Mapping of institutional frameworks
 - Development of advocacy tools on this topic
